




Ensuring models are built on true costs and transparency




Reducing administrative burden on libraries/authors





Pain points: Systems interoperability...



When these systems cannot speak to each other, the amount of manual work increases; data hygiene drops.

Data, modeling, and reporting all need...



Communication:

- 1. Starting from the listener's primary concern/need
- 2. Process, not just results
- 3. Updates
- 4. Knowing how detailed and when
- 5. If you're asking for feedback, use it. If not, explain.
