FRAME: Federated Repositories of Accessible Materials for Higher Education

- *Four-year Mellon-funded project.*
- *Libraries, repositories, disability services offices (DSOs), & university presses.*
- *Creating a repository to provide federated access to metadata, source files, and remediated files.*
- *DSOs have access to retrieve or deposit files and ensure that recipients are qualified.*

- *EMMA, Educational Materials Made Accessible, a new repository at UVa based on Bookshare*
- *Soon, collaborating with, Ace, the Accessible Content ePortal from OCUL (the Ontario Council of University Libraries), in a test of Marrakesh.*

The Initial Priorities

- Began with an *environmental scan* that revealed wide misunderstanding of legal issues by DSOs.
- Convened legal experts for January 2019 meeting at ARL in DC on *"The Law and Accessible Texts"*
- Produced White Paper, *"Reconciling Civil Rights and Copyrights: The Law and Accessible Texts"*
- Identified *two significant needs*:
 - *Metadata* to describe remediated assets
 - *Education* about accessibility and remediation

Priorities for Phase One (2019-2020)

- *Initial focus on books*
- *Built on Bookshare technology stack*
- *Develop metadata model*
- *Develop Unified Search (across all four repositories)*
- *Develop UX for deposit of remediated resources*
- *Work with IA for initial batch upload process*
- *Initial piloting, feedback from DSOs*

FRAME Metadata Model

- **IDENTIFIERS**—*Parties, Users, Items, Public IDs, etc.*
- **BIBLIOGRAPHIC METADATA**—*Title, Contributor (e.g., authors), Publisher, Version (e.g., edition), Pub Date, Series (e.g., journal), Language, etc.*
- **ADMIN METADATA**—*Remediated By, Date Submitted, Source File, Provider of Source (e.g., Publisher), etc.*
- **REMEDICATION METADATA**—*Format, File Type, Features (e.g., tables, equations), Text Quality, Remediation Comments, EPUB Accessibility Metadata, etc.*

Priorities for Phase Two (2021-2022)

- *Expand scope to include journals, video, and audio*
- *Refine Unified Search (across all four repositories)*
- *Refine UX for deposit of remediated resources*
- *Develop standardized batch upload process*
- *Integrate two new partners, Ace and Ohio State*
- *Work with NISO to standardize metadata model*
- *Create membership org to be self-sustaining*
- *Create educational program*

FRAME Educational Program

- Developing *formal MS course* to be delivered online Fall 2022 at Illinois
- Adopting *modular course design* to allow independent use of materials (i.e., standalone for training purposes; integrated for formal courses)
- *Releasing materials online* for access by current and future stakeholders
- Publishing materials under *open license courses* to encourage reuse

Some Learning Goals

- *General background* on disability in higher education (demographics, disabilities, challenges, accommodations)
- Explain *the work of DSOs* to library school students (and vice versa)
- How to use the *metadata* developed for this project
- *Document/file formats, automated techniques* for remediation
- *Legal frameworks* that apply in this work
- Introduce *research opportunities* in the field
