


A voluntary code for journal publishers containing best practices for transferring and receiving journals.



## WHY DO PUBLISHERS & SOCIETIES LOVE TRANSFER?

- Succinct checklist for both transferring and receiving publishers
- Helps you not overlook important assets and information
- Suggests timeline benchmarks
- Not prescriptive you do things the way it works best for you

## WHY DO PUBLISHERS & SOCIETIES NOT JOIN TRANSFER?

- We never receive or transfer titles
  - (except for those few times)
- We send out all of the relevant information that librarians need in our newsletters
  - (Really? The new URL? The date of the transfer? Who has the perpetual access? Both leavers and takeovers?)
- Why should we have to follow another long rigid procedure?
  - (It's only 7 pages. 4 for the transferring publisher, 2 for the receiver. It is written mostly by publishers involved in transfers to help you get the information you need for a successful transfer).

### BENEFITS FOR LIBRARIES

- The TAS: Sign up to receive alerts and/or search the database
- All the information you need in one place:
  - The URL!
  - When the transfer is effective the exact volume
  - Which publisher has the archive and can provide your perpetual access
- ONLY bad thing:
  - Why are there so many publishers who don't participate?

#### Welcome to the Transfer Alerting Service

The NISO Transfer Code of Practice sets out best practices for scholarly publishers to ensure that journal transfers between parties occur with minimum disruption and that the content remains accessible. The Transfer Alerting Service (TAS) has been designed to facilitate communication of journal transfers and is hosted by the International ISSN Centre.

The TAS is made up of:

- · A database of journal transfers which can be searched or browsed. This allows librarians and other interested parties to access the details of journal transfers announced through the TAS and provides an archive of transfer information supplied by publishers using the service.
- A notification service available through an RSS feed or by signing-up to a dedicated mailing list. Librarians, information professionals, and representatives of other organisations with an interest in journal transfers are encouraged to sign up to the list. Every time a journal transfer is announced through the TAS, registrants receive email alerts detailing the journal(s) involved, bibliographic information, and contact details for the publishers involved.
- An API which may be used by interested parties to guery or integrate with the TAS.

Publishers are required to register with the ISSN International Centre to provide journal transfer information for announcement through the TAS. Under the terms of the Code, endorsing publishers are required to use the service whenever they receive a new journal.

API

I is generally RESTFUL and returns results in JSON.

BaseURL

https://journaltransfer.issn.org/transfer/search\_transfer/api? - querying this URL will return a list of all the transfers recorded within the ETAS database.

#### API Filters

To refine the query, filters may be appended to the BaseURL as a QueryString:

?key1=value1&key2=value2...


